Sharing Mr. A

- Mr A, 22 year young engineering student male, Cannabis, Solvent use, Bipolar versus Schizophrenia versus Schizoaffective: substance induced or Independent from 2000 km from Bangalore
- Mother working, father equally busy, changing psychopathology, visit us once in 3 to 6 months, take flights from 2000 km,
- Am not able to make a clear diagnosis, they speak a language which i do not understand very well
- Am struggling with diagnosis, he is continued to use, hallucinate, psychopathology
- For last two years have made at least 6-8 visits



What else?

- Have lost two close family members due to mental health and substance use issues
- Unavailability to "access" to "right knowledge"

Being Mentored over the years....

- NIMHANS has been forefront in human resource training
- Before Physicians, specialists, residents, public health experts, counsellors etc. will be visiting NIMHANS for short term training (often funded by Govt)
- Training will be for 2 weeks to one month maximum: depending on resources
- But post-training there is no follow up, no handholding, no-mentoring






Hence we are looking out of innovative ideas: 1st ECHO on 25th March 2014





Chhattisgarh Integrated Addiction and Mental Health ECHOs

Chhattisgarh Counsellors ECHO

- Over the period of 6 months i.e. 12 tele-ECHO clinics, 41 patients case summaries were discussed by the Counsellors with NIMHANS Hub Specialists (Hindi)
- Half of the counsellors could join >80% clinics and overall there were no drop-outs
- During the 6-month period, these 12 counsellors had provided clinical services to a total of 4743 patients.




Impact of mental health and addiction NIMHANS ECHO on primary care physicians: study from a rural state of India

Published online by Cambridge University Press: 18 June 2021

- 10 months ECHO mentoring Chhattisgarh
- 30 physicians working in Govt hospitalsCHC and only 5 dropped out
- Statistically significant change in knowledge and skills
- 10 fold increase in number of patients evaluated
- Best research paper in National Academy of Medical Sciences and got 1st prize from Honorable Vice president of India

 opened up for various health providers as well as lay counsellors
- Professional interaction with colleagues with similar interest
- Access to specialty consultation with addiction specialist




